

In this unit, you should:

- Order Creation and Fall, Incarnation, Gospel and Salvation on the Big Frieze.
- Talk about what the Gospel texts tell us about Jesus' entry into Jerusalem, and what the death and resurrection of Jesus might mean.
- Describe how Christians show their beliefs about Palm Sunday, Good Friday and Easter Sunday in worship.
- Make links between some of the stories and teachings in the Bible and life in the world today, talking about some ideas of your own clearly.



Key vocabulary:

- Salvation:** preservation or deliverance from harm, ruin, or loss.
- Crucifix:** an image of a cross with a figure of Christ on it
- Resurrection:** the rising of Christ from the dead.
- The Fall:** When sin was brought into the world by Adam and Eve in the book of Genesis.
- Disciple:** a personal follower of Christ during his life, especially one of the twelve Apostles.
- Holy Week:** The week before Easter, starting on Palm Sunday.
- Palm Sunday:** the Sunday before Easter, on which Christ's entry into Jerusalem is celebrated in many Christian churches by processions in which branches of palms are carried.
- Good Friday:** the Friday before Easter Sunday, on which the Crucifixion of Christ is commemorated in the Christian Church. It is traditionally a day of fasting and penance.
- Easter Sunday:** the day on which the festival of Easter is celebrated to remember the resurrection of Christ.

Key content:

- Christians see Holy Week as the culmination of Jesus' earthly life, leading to his death and resurrection.
- The various events of Holy Week, such as the Last Supper, were important in showing the disciples what Jesus came to earth to do.
- Christians today trust that Jesus really did rise from the dead, and so is still alive today.
- Christians remember and celebrate Jesus' last week, death and resurrection.
