


# YORK RESIDENTIAL 2025

# Day 1

- Children arrive in school from 7.50am. We aim to leave by 8.30am at the latest. No parking on site or Bunbury Road.
- Please use kit list as a guide. Please pack with your child. Tip: Pack clothes in separate bags for each day. **NAME EVERYTHING!**
- Children need all clothes in one suitcase or bag that they can move themselves.
- Wellingtons plus socks in separate **NAMED** bag.

- Children need a backpack for everyday use- hat, gloves kept in there.
  - Packed lunch for first day in a plastic bag to throw away. No lunch box please. A refillable water bottle.
  - Medicines are handed in to coach 'nurse'. Please fill in medication form.
  - Children can bring small games, magazines, puzzles books, reading books, pens for coach journeys.

All bedding is provided. Children need to bring a towel.





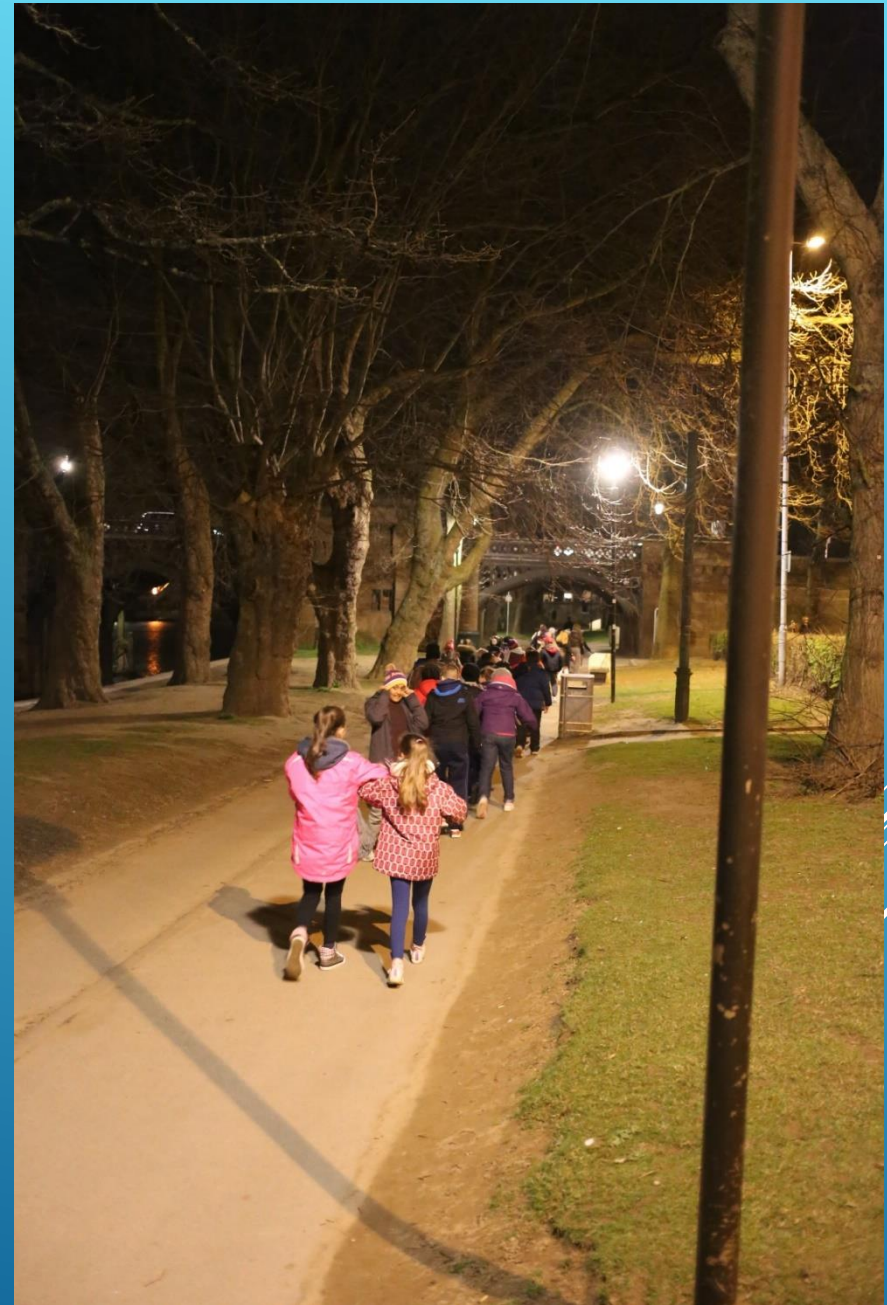

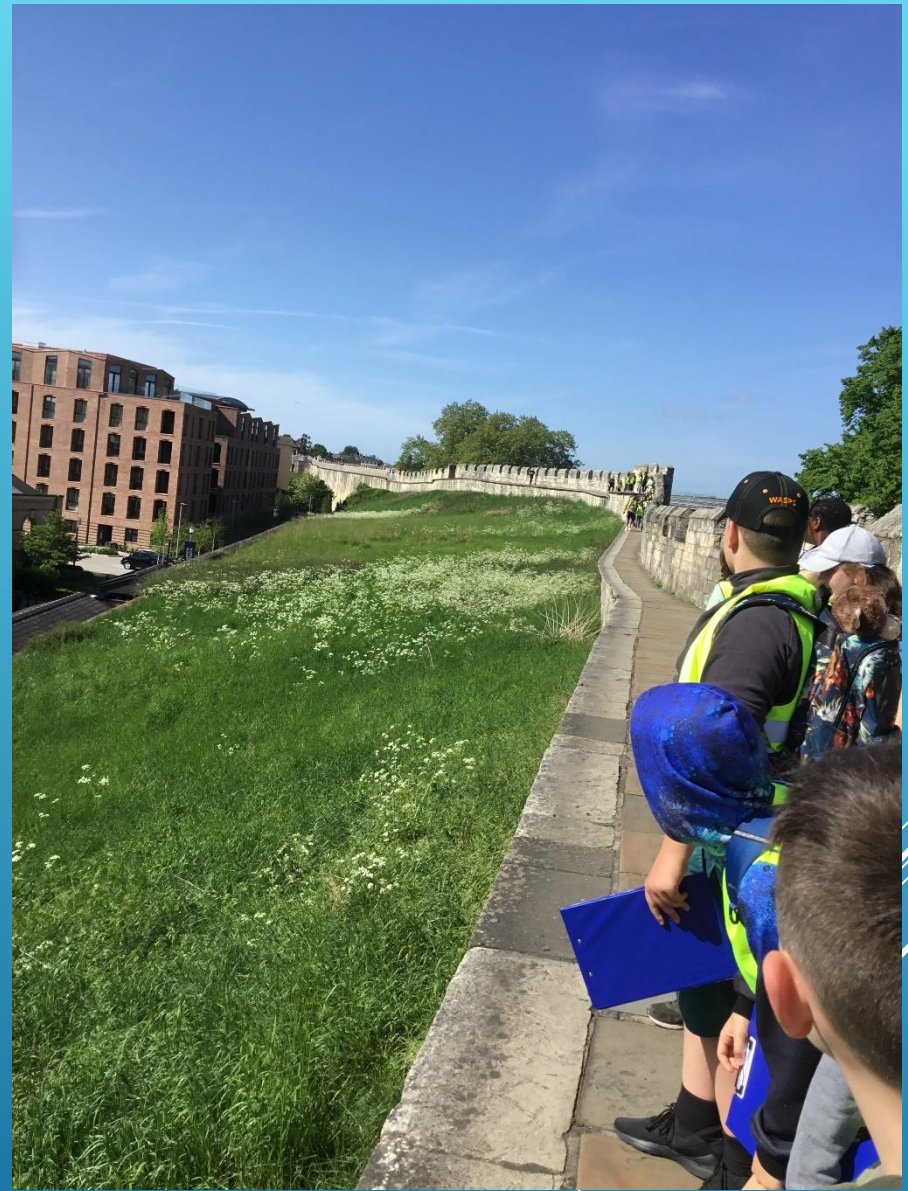

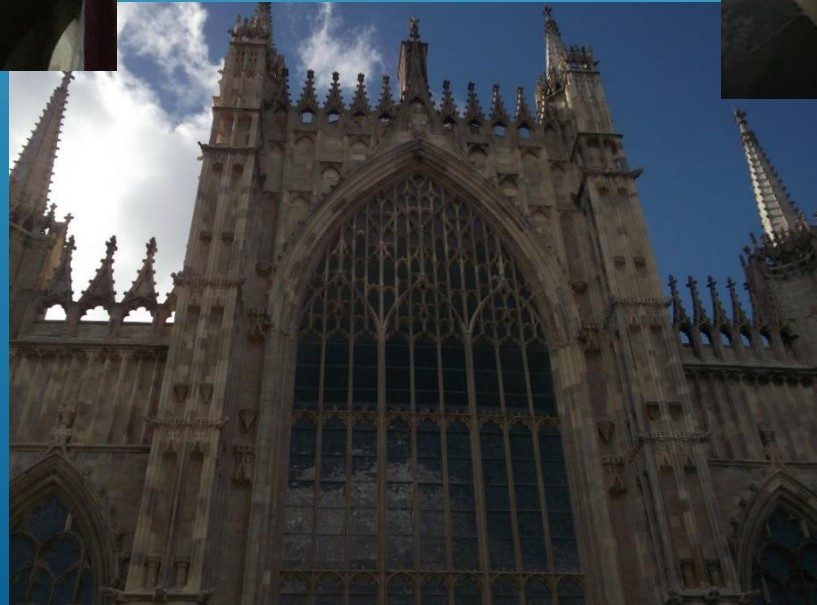

## IN THE VIKING AGE

Viking Age coins were mainly valued by their weight in silver rather than their value as with today's coins.

Coins minted by the Viking kings in England were struck in silver.

They were often cut into halves (halfpennies) or quarters.

Many of these coins have been found in excavations.

Some feature Christian and pagan symbols.

One from York features the name of the Christian St Peter.

Another shows the symbol of the pagan god Thor.

Coins were found in York during the famous Coppergate excavation.

They were used to make the replica coins at JORVIK today.

One is the 'Mersey Penny' and a design from a penny of the

Northumbrian king, the dirham which was minted furthest!

It was found in Britain - large numbers were found in a hurry in time.

They were discovered in the Middle East.
